Dr. J. Dennis Omlor passed away peacefully on April 11, 2013 at the age of 68. He was a longtime resident of Berea, OH and also held residency in Brodhead, WI. He married Karen Austin on June 24, 1967 at The Congregational Church in Manhasset, Long Island, NY. Dennis was born and raised in Yukon, PA. He graduated from South Huntington H.S. in 1961, received his BS degree from Westminster College, New Wilmington, PA in 1965, received his MS degree from Cleveland State University, Cleveland, OH in 1971, and ultimately received his Ph.D. from Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, OH In 1978. He was a Computer Science professor at Cleveland State University and Cuyahoga Community College. He served the IT industry working at IBM, LTV Steel, and Omlor Data Systems. Dennis loved traveling, dining, gardening, gambling, golf, springer spaniels, politics, Civil War history, the Steelers football team, Sudoku, Genealogy, TV classics and westerns, and telling bad jokes. His humor and smile lifted our spirits and warmed our hearts. He is survived by his wife of 45 years, Karen (nee Austin); a sister, Marcia (Robert) Wallhagen; aunt Ginny (late Joe Stangry); uncle Mike (late Vera) Leon; nephew Eric Wallhagen; nieces Carol'Ann Wallhagen and Christa Dominico; son Scott Nimrod, and many wonderful cousins and close friends.
