Allen C. McCartney, age 96, of Durand, IL, passed away on Saturday, December 26, 2015 at Woods Crossing Nursing Home, Brodhead, WI. He was born on April 14, 1919 in Rockford, IL, the son of James and Josephine (Ingwalson) McCartney. He married Harriette Peterson on June 20, 1941 in Rockford, IL. She passed away on March 17, 2002. Allen attended Rockford Central High School. He served in the U.S. Navy and moved to Durand in 1946. He started Greene and McCartney Implement in 1950. In 1960 he bought out his partner and started A.C. McCartney Farm Equipment. He was a member of the Trinity Lutheran Church, Durand American Legion, Durand Athletic Association, Durand Volunteer Fire Dept., and the Durand Centennial Committee. Allen loved traveling and enjoyed driving to Las Vegas. He is survived by his sons, David (Maxine) McCartney, Woody (Karen) McCartney; daughter, Nancy McCartney; eight grandchildren, Colleen (Jeff) Custer, Jim (Laura) McCartney, Phillip (Mariya) Walsh, Paula (Randy) Lutzow, Korina McCartney, Mark (Nicki) McCartney, Amy (Bob) Schimmel, Andy (Selina) McCartney; 10 adopted step-grandchildren; 17 great-grandchildren. He was preceded in death by his wife, two brothers and five sisters.
