Joyce M. Ensor, age 67, of Oconomowoc, formerly of Brodhead, passed away on Tuesday, August 26, 2014, at Waukesha Memorial Hospital. She was born on May 27, 1947 in Milwaukee, the daughter of LeRoy and Bernice (Young) Ensor. She married Wayne Weber on July 8, 1989 in Wauwatosa. Joyce graduated from Brodhead High School in 1965. She obtained her undergraduate degree in music from UW-Milwaukee, her Masters in Music Therapy from Montclair State University and also an undergraduate degree as a physicians assistant from the UW-Madison. She worked in music therapy in NJ, was a professor of music therapy at UW-Milwaukee, was certified as a physicians assistant in urology and also worked at a drug treatment center in Madison, WI. Joyce taught heirloom sewing, and was an active member of the Hartland Community Band. She enjoyed photography, especially capturing wild life and waterfall pictures, She was respected and loved by all. She is survived by her husband Wayne; a sister, Jean (Tom) Woodruff, Brodhead, WI; a special aunt and several nieces and nephews. She was preceded in death by her parents and a brother David.
