



## Neale R. Scott

November 1, 1944 - October 31, 2011

Neale R. Scott, age 66, of Brodhead, passed away on Monday, October 31, 2011, at Agrace HospiceCare Inc, Madison. He was born on November 1, 1944 in Monroe, WI, the son of LeRoy and Phyllis (Hanson) Scott. He married Lois B. Becher on August 5, 1967 in Evansville, WI. Neale graduated from Orfordville High School in 1962, Green County Normal Teachers College and finished his B.S. at Whitewater in 1972. He taught 7th and 8th grade science in Juda from 1964 until 1984 and in Brodhead from 1984 until 2000. He was also Athletic Director at both grade schools and a Varsity Basketball Coach in Juda. He was a member of the Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Brodhead, Wisconsin Athletic Directors Assoc., the Order of the Moose, and was instrumental in forming the Brodhead Youth Ball Program. He enjoyed hunting, fishing, softball, and being with his family. He is survived by his wife Lois of Brodhead; three children, Doug Scott, Dan (Tami) Scott, both of Beloit, Kathy (Darren) Roth, Juda; a brother, Alan (Jean) Scott, Camarillo, CA, a sister, Mary (Cathy Accardi) Scott, Madison; five grandchildren, Ethan, Megan, Brody, Madelyn, and Miah. He was preceded in death by his parents. Funeral services will be held at 11:00 a.m., Friday, November 4, 2011, at the Bethlehem Lutheran Church, Brodhead, with Pastor Peder Johanson officiating. Burial will be in Greenwood Cemetery, Brodhead. Visitation will be held from 5 p.m. until 8 p.m. on Thursday at the D.L. Newcomer Funeral Home, Brodhead, WI. A memorial fund will be established. ♦

“ Neale Scott – Through My Eyes

*Teacher, father, welcoming, accepting, supportive, giving, loving, calming, smart-aleck. To me, these are words that are closely associated with Neale Scott.*

*When I think about Mr. Scott (I still can't call him Neale – just doesn't seem right), the first thing that comes to my head is large gatherings of people (usually many teachers) in the garage all having a good time just chatting and hanging out. It always felt so friendly. Good food, cold drinks, warm stove, and fun people. Our “group” (Doug's friends) would walk through the crowd after playing basketball, football, trap shooting, or any of the other variety of available options at the Scott household, and people would stop us and ask us how we were doing, how our parents were, or what we were going to do with our lives. Always a caring, hometown feeling there. This is the type of environment that Mr. Scott inspired.*

*As an adult, I think about the things we did at the Scott household, the things we broke, the things we tried to fix, and then ended up breaking it worse... I know that, put in his shoes, my reaction to these events would have probably been much different than Mr. Scotts. He never got excited about “little” things like that. He made it clear that you had some ownership for putting it right, but I don't recall ever seeing him angry or upset at us. Calm and direct. That was his style. I also loved his casual “zingers”, quick insults about how long your hair was, the condition your car was in, or the current status of your ex-girlfriend. His jokes were always like terms of endearment and always made everyone laugh.*

*The Scott home was a place of refuge for me. After high school, I really didn't have a place to call home in Brodhead. The Scott house became my second home. I had a place of my own in Madison, but Brodhead was still home and I found myself coming back many weekends. I can't tell you how much I appreciated having a place to go – no questions asked – anytime I wanted. Mrs.*

*Scott always had food for us. I now realize how much time and money is used when you're feeding many hungry young men. Again, I am so appreciative and blessed to have had you there at that time in my life. Such seemingly small things that meant (and still mean) so much.*

*I am very sad to no longer have Mr. Scott with us. Only now do I realize that I never truly thanked him for everything he had done for me. Mrs. Scott, please know how much I love you and your husband and how much you've meant to me over the years. I can never truly repay all the blessings, but I can and will pass them on to others.*

*I'll miss you Mr. Scott. Know that you are loved and missed by many here.*
